


Q1: Has COVID-19 caused you to change how you currently manage frontline operations key staff in support of operational resiliency?







Q4: Have you checked into possible supply chain problems to confirm delivery of essential inputs?





Q6: Has your municipality/utility temporarily changed or suspended any work activities because of COVID-19?





and testing programs?



Q8: In light of essential work being defined by the province, what type of construction activities are still ongoing in your region/city/township?






Q9: Has your organization equipped front line wastewater staff with additional direction on PPE measures?

Q10: What additional measures do you have in place to allow visitors (contractors) access to facilities to allow essential or emergency capital and maintenance projects to continue?



Q11: Has COVID-19 impacted your community notification protocols for wastewater spills and bypass events?






Q12: The COVID-19 emergency and cost relief programs for ratepayers may impact our cash flow and revenues:
